Main objective of Dutch efforts in the period of 2019 - 2022*:

In recent years, many Syrians have fled to Lebanon because of the war in their own country. This is causing problems in Lebanon, a small country, where there are not enough schools and jobs for everyone. The Netherlands therefore helps provide schooling for both refugees and host communities, which will in turn help them find work and promote social stability. Lebanon is one of the EU's neighbouring countries, so its continuing stability is in the Netherlands' interests.

Lebanon has been a good partner to the Netherlands and the EU for many years. The Netherlands has for example been supporting the UN mission in the south of Lebanon on the border with Israel to help keep the area safe.
